Dear Parishioners

Today I would like to highlight three items of parish news.

Stewardship Sunday

In our "Kingdom of God" preaching series, this Sunday's theme is "A kingdom of generosity". This will be our Stewardship Sunday for this year, on which we reflect particularly on our giving of money to God's work through the local church. On Stewardship Sunday it is customary for the parish to provide a stewardship pack, containing a pledging form, a letter from the Wardens etc, for all parishioners. Since we are not worshipping in church this Sunday, we plan to get your stewardship pack to you at a later date.

Covid-19 has made life extremely difficult for some people, and the Vestry acknowledges that not everyone will be able to increase or even maintain their level of giving. That makes it all the more important that those who can give generously maintain or increase their giving to the parish, so that together we can continue to provide for the needs of the parish and its mission to our community.

In various parts of the New Testament, followers of Christ are encouraged to give with a generous heart, regularly, and in proportion to our income, so that God's blessing to us is passed on as a blessing to others.

This notification allows the Bishops to engage someone else for the position of Chaplain of the English-speaking congregation at St George's in Tunis.

After the struggle we have had to make this decision, we hope to pause from major life decisions for a little while! We are very grateful to everyone who has been praying for us over the last six months.
