To enable us to mark the Hall Project milestone, celebrate together as a Parish and to mark the St James' Patronal festival we have some special events coming up over the next few weeks.

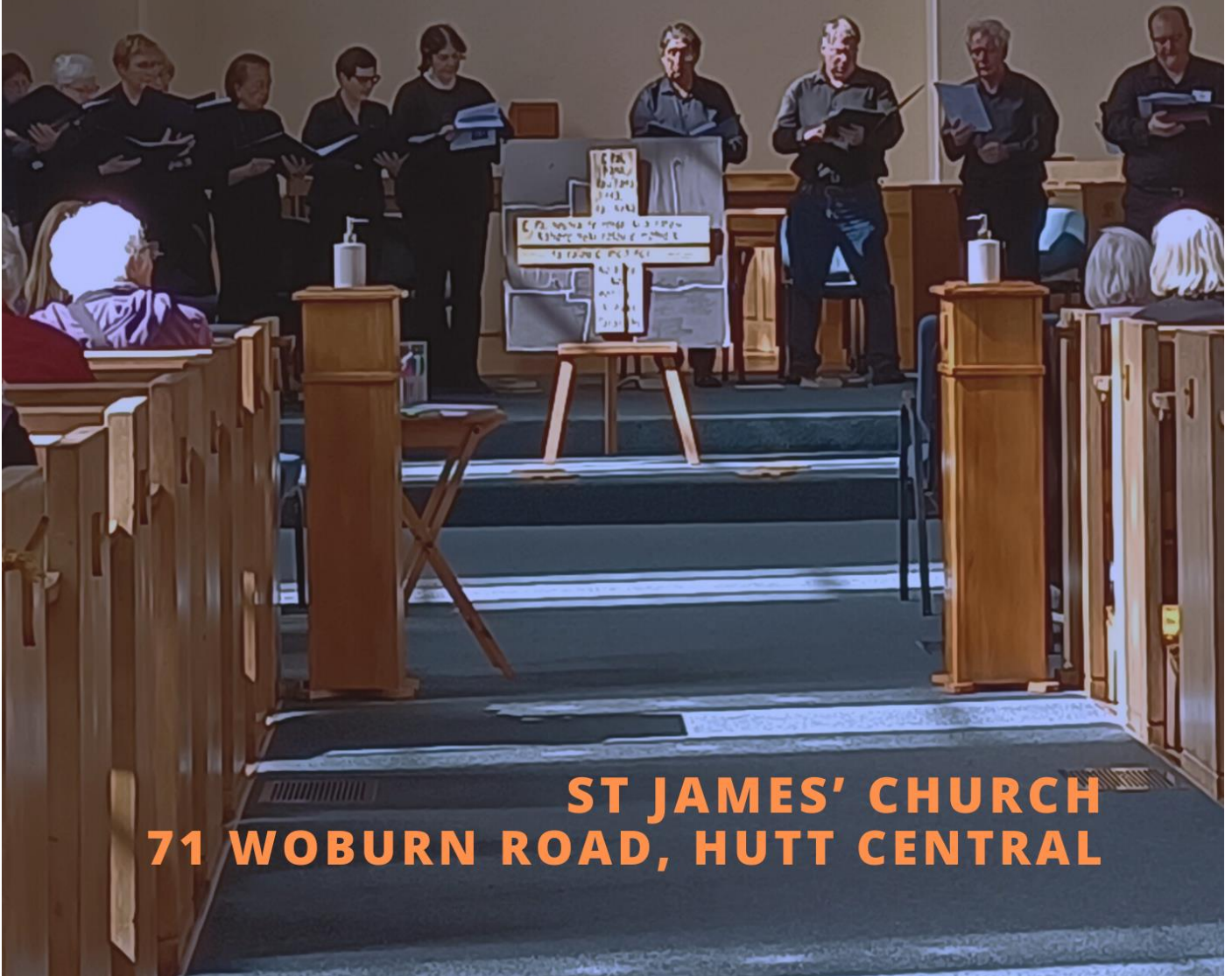
Please make sure you mark these important days in your diaries! It's great to be able to get together!

The acclaimed Christs College Chapel Choir from Cambridge, UK is returning to New Zealand in July 2024, following the success of their 2019 tour. The choir undertakes a substantial international tour each summer. Details of past tours, various recordings, and general information about the choir can be explored to the right.

Choir Director Prof. David Rowland says: 'Coming to New Zealand is always a treat for the choir. The choir numbers around 24 singers and is supported by two organ scholars and myself as the Director of Music. The choir's recordings feature on the BBC's broadcasts and each year it performs concerts in the UK and abroad, most recently in the USA and Canada, as well as singing regularly for services in the College chapel. Performances in New Zealand will include music from the sixteenth century to the present day, including established church music repertoire and music by contemporary composers.'

### **Biography - The Choir of Christ's College, Cambridge**

Christ's College is one of the constituent colleges of the University of Cambridge, and has had a chapel choir since its foundation in 1505. Conducted by Professor David Rowland, director of music at Christ's College, the choir sings a selection of music from English and European choral traditions from the 16th to 20th century.

The Choir's raison d'etre has, since its inception, been to sing services in the College Chapel. Choral Evensong is sung twice weekly during Full Term. More generally, the Choir makes an important contribution to the life of the College, singing at feasts, weddings, memorial services and other occasions.

Today, as one of Cambridge's finest mixed-voice ensembles, the group also pursues an exciting range of activities outside College, performing concerts in Cambridge and around the UK, recording CDs, broadcasting, and undertaking major international tours each Summer. Choir members are selected by audition either before or after coming up to Cambridge, and each is expected to be of a very high musical standard. Most hold Choral Exhibitions, and all benefit from regular vocal training.

The choir has a broad concert repertoire. This tour they are singing a wide range of music: Parry's Songs of Farewell, Howell's Requiem, Finzi's Lo, The Full, Final Sacrifice, to name a few, maintaining a variety of music from both religious and secular traditions, ranging from Tallis to Britten.

### **'A chat with the Archdeacon Emeritus, Judy Hardie' by Sue Barlow**

For our May meeting, AAW St James invited retired archdeacon, Judy Hardie to be our speaker. Few of the members knew what an archdeacon did, and a Google search said that he/she was largely an administrative assistant to the bishop.

The Archdeacon Emeritus Judy began by talking about how difficult originally it had been to become ordained as a priest although she had already passed her L.Th. The Anglican Church in NZ did not allow the ordination of women until 1977 but Judy persevered to become a curate, priest and finally, archdeacon. Compared with other professions the clergy were slow to admit women. In comparison, by 1935, there were female teachers although they were forbidden to marry and rules about personal appearance stipulated, "No bright colours, a dress no shorter than 2" above the ankle, at least 2 petticoats, and in no circumstances could a teacher dye her hair."

A highlight of her talk were the vestments Judy brought with her. There were brightly coloured stoles to mark the church seasons and a delicate salmon pink cope centrally embroidered with sprays of native flowers by the women of St James parish. The robes, decorated with New Zealand flowers are lovely, lasting and colourful.

By the end, we understood far more about the roles of an archdeacon, but for some of us, the question had changed from, "What does an archdeacon do?" to "What does it take to be an archdeacon?" Some private answers were suggested, "Faith and tolerance, in equal helpings."

Thank you, Archdeacon Emeritus Judy, for an impressive and inspiring chat.
