

This 'Safe Faiths' survey has been created because there is little or no research or quantitative data in Aotearoa that explores whether Takatāpui/Rainbow Christians feel safe attending their church or faith community.

The survey results from gathering Takatāpui/Rainbow Christian perspectives on how safe they feel within the churches/faith communities that they attend will be used to raise awareness of issues faced by Takatāpui / Rainbow Christians in Aotearoa New Zealand, and to support Takatāpui / Rainbow advocacy work, both within the church and more widely.
